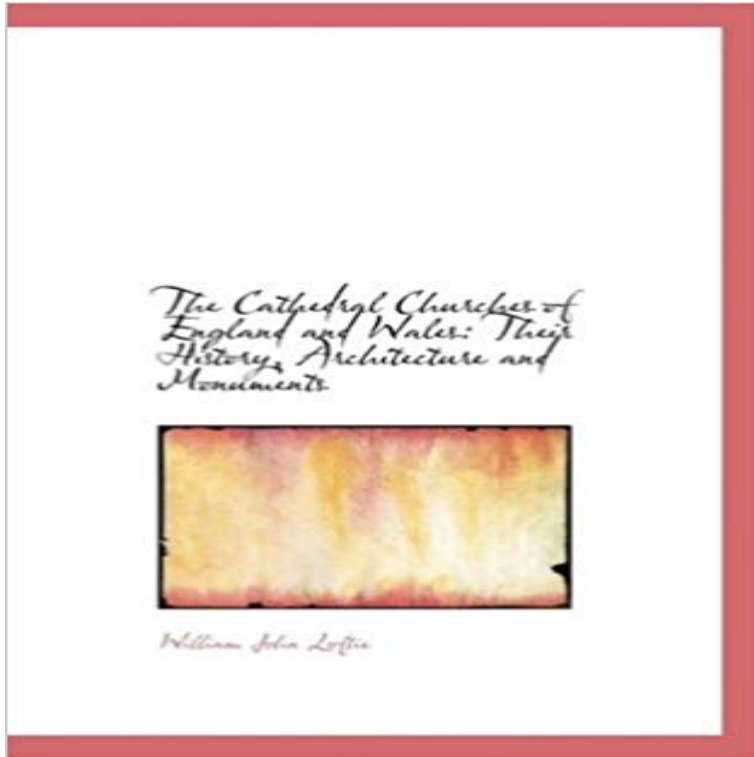


The Cathedral Churches of England and Wales: Their History, Architecture and Monuments
